Summer 2: Learning opportunities: Where is Shanghai?

Here are a variety of **OPTIONAL** activities which you may wish to do with your child out of school to support and extend their learning in school.

Practise the spellings on the sheet that is sent home each week. It is up to you how you choose to do this.	Practise 'spending' 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p to find a total. Play at shops and cafes. Practise reading o'clock and half past times on a clock. Continue count in 2's 5's and 10's. Practise finding halves and quarters of food items, shapes and small amounts, such as half a cake or pizza and a quarter of a bag of marbles etc.	Write a pretend postcard from places you have visited or would like to visit. Write a fact file about a place you know well. Write instructions to look after a plant or to how to plant a seed. Keep a diary of your growing plant.	Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read. Find a book about towns and cities that are different to Ilkley. Visit Ilkley library and find non-fiction books about plants and minibeasts. Challenge yourself to read 3 or more books by the same author.	Visit the Oxford Owl website and complete your weekly reading tasks. You will find your log in details inside your reading record. Visit Purple Mash and Numbots to practise your keyboard skills and quick number facts.

This half term we are learning all about -'Where is Shanghai?'

Here are some ideas if you wish to carry on your learning at home:

- Find out about plants, flowers and trees growing near your house.
- Build a simple bug hotel using cones, twigs and leaves.
- Look for signs of seasonal change, including leaves and buds on trees and plants. You could draw them or take photos or make an art collage.
- Design a dream city based on the things you like and the people who would live there.
