INSTRUMENTAL/VOCAL LESSONS – ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/2025

Music and Arts have asked us to share the following information about parent paid for instrumental music lessons available taught in school for September.

Music and Arts have peripatetic music teachers who visit school each week from Bradford Music and Arts service, providing lessons on a wide range of instruments.

The cost of music service lessons is £67 per term for a 20 minute small group lesson each week, or £181 per term for a 20 minute individual lesson each week.

Parents are billed directly by Bradford Music and Arts service, and there is also an additional charge for instrument hire if required.

Children will receive a minimum of thirty lessons through the academic year.

Please ensure you put down your 3 instrument choices to give you more chance of getting a lesson in September 2024 and return to the Music & Arts Service as soon as possible.
