<p>Spelling: Practise the Year3/4 and Year 5/6 statutory word lists, using games that we have learnt in school.</p>	<p>Timetables: You could help your child at home by allowing them to play on TT rockstars. This will help them with the fluency of their timetables. 'Hit the button' is also another online activity on the Topmarks website. Prodigy Maths</p>	<p>Writing: You are a pharaoh for a day! Write about what you would do during your day. What commands would you give your people? Remember, your subjects worship you as a god!</p> 	<p>Reading: Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read.</p>	<p>Science Try growing a plant in an unusual place (in a dark cupboard, in the freezer, under your bed) – record what happens.</p> 	<p>Computing: You could help your child to develop their touch-typing skills by enjoying BBC dance mat typing BBC Bitesize</p>
